Co-Ownership and Leasing Agreements Policy

CO-OWNERSHIP:

Any Terrier that is co-owned by two individuals with separate JRTCC Registered Kennel names MUST be Registered in the joint names of both owners. One address and phone number will be used for purposes of Registration records. The address of either co-owner may be used as preferred. A Co-Ownership Agreement should be signed, dated and submitted for placement in the Terrier's Registration file. (Note: BOTH owners must be current members in good standing of the JRTCC).

If the co-owned Terrier is a Bitch which is to be bred during the term of co-ownership, there MUST be a written contract, signed by both parties, which clearly defines which of the two owners' Registered Kennel prefix is to be used as the prefix for the Registered/Recorded offspring The litter(s) may carry ONLY ONE prefix (i.e. half the pups cannot carry the prefix of one owner, while the other half that of the second owner). If there is no such Agreement on file, the offspring of said bitch will carry NO prefix.

If the co-owned Terrier is a Stud Dog, the Stud Certificate may be signed by either owner.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

If the co-owned Bitch is Registered to only one individual, the JRTCC considers that Terrier to be owned solely by the Registered owner.

Therefore any pedigrees, trial results, certificates, etc. which show any different or additional names would be considered invalid by the JRTCC. Any litter(s) resulting from said Terrier would be considered **bred by the Registered owner only.** Any Co-Ownership Agreements not submitted for placement in the Terrier's Registration or Recording file do not exist as far as the Club is concerned. Any/all resulting problems or disagreements between Owners are considered to be a Civil Matter between the individuals involved. It is the responsibility of the person purchasing the Terrier under a Co-Ownership Agreement to ensure that their Agreement includes the proper Registration of the Terrier in both names.

LEASING:

The JRTCC Registration system does not recognize leasing of Jack Russell Terriers. Leasing is in effect a temporary transfer of ownership, and for the purposes of the JRTCC Registration any lease situation must be treated as a transfer of ownership for the period of the Lease Agreement. At the end of the Agreement, the lease would return the ownership to the lessor by transferring the JRTCC Registration back to the original owner. The terms of any Lease Agreement are considered a personal matter between the individuals. For the purposes of the JRTCC Registration it must be considered a transfer of ownership.
