Outcrossing Registration Policy

The JRTCC does not recommend breeding to anything other than another JRTCC/JRTCA/JRTCGB registered Jack Russell Terrier. In the event a JRTCC breeder decides it is necessary to outcross to another non-AKC registered working terrier breed for working purposes, the JRTCC will not consider it a violation to the Breeders Code of Ethics (BCOE). However, the JRTCC will NOT register the progeny of such a cross until the outcross terrier is in the third generation.

The outcross terrier MUST be clearly noted on the pedigree, and must be an acceptable working terrier that is NOT kennel club registered.

The same policy applies if a terrier is purchased from overseas or in the USA whose pedigree contains an outcross within the first two generations.

The JRTCC considers its registry an OPEN registry because it accepts Jack Russell Terriers whose parents are not registered with the JRTCC/JRTCA. The intent is to permit terriers and their owners who were not previously within the JRTCC to join, or for those terriers to become registered.
